## **Spring Fundraisers Successful**

Thank you to our members and the community for their support of two major fundraisers this year. The Used Book Sale on May 10 added \$3,700 to our budget. FOML will be able to support children and adult programs at the library, get books into the hands and homes of children and help fund needed library materials.

The community also enjoyed access to low-cost high-quality new books for children and teens at FOML's June Scholastic Book Fair. Over \$5,000 worth of books were sold. FOML banked approximately \$2,500 in credit for the future and used existing credit to buy close to 90 books for library collections or programs, including the all ages (even adults!) Summer Reading challenge.

In fiscal year 2022-23 FOML donated a total of \$5,910.09 worth of books to the Modesto Library using Scholastic credit earned at book fairs held each spring and fall.

#### **Library Foundation Advocates For All Stanislaus County Libraries**

Susan Thomas, Stanislaus Library Foundation president, speaking recently to FOML board members, said "inform, educate, and support" are the basics of SLF's advocacy efforts. During the last two years the group has become more visible by speaking before elected and appointed bodies and having booths at public events. Messages include: our libraries are great places in our communities and every community deserves a beautiful facility. This year the Foundation board will focus on how we can accomplish making our library system outstanding. The Foundation fundraises and advocates for all 13 county libraries.

Advocacy is especially important in the coming years since the primary funding for our county library system, a county-wide 1/8-cent library tax, expires June 30, 2030. This is the primary funding source for Stanislaus County libraries. The tax measure will be on the ballot sometime in the next five years. FOML is beginning to formulate its advocacy plan.

During a presentation before Friends' leaders from through the county, a group discussion highlighted some reasons why advocacy is important. Although you may be well informed about our library system, others may believe libraries are no longer needed or know how our local system is funded. Many county residents do not realize library cards are free and what is available in the library and online.

You become a library advocate when you encourage people to join a Friends group, help others discover what libraries offer and remind parents to read to their young children.



### **Modesto Nuts Encourage Literacy!**

The Modesto Nuts support an annual program that encourages and incentivizes students in Stanislaus County to read. Since 2002 the Nuts' reading program has motivated around 400,000 students to meet a reading goal. Prizes for meeting weekly goals are given and readers completing the entire four-week program receive a Modesto Nuts game ticket, a hotdog, and a drink. A pregame parade showcases all the readers. The Nuts provide schools with information, posters, prizes, and even a kick-off program.
