Big Renovation Project Will Upgrade AC, Lighting, Security

We're excited to learn that Stanislaus County will receive \$9.97 million from the California State Library as part of \$172 million in facility improvement grants going to 34 libraries around the state. We asked Stanislaus County Librarian Sarah Dentan and Facilities Manager Marco Sepulveda to tell us more.

Q: Briefly, what will this money be used for?

A: The money will be used to address some critical renovation needs at the Modesto Library. The scope is intended to address asbestos concerns above the A: The library is committed to providing ceiling, address accessibility issues in the children's story time room, install new acoustic ceiling tiles, and to provide for LED lighting upgrades, HVAC modernization, construction of new spaces and to address security concerns.

Q: Will local dollars be put into this project as well?

A: Yes, we will be using local dollars on the project as the state grant requires a 50 percent match by the local library. The project is going to have a total budget of roughly \$18 million, broken down as follows:

\$9.9 million in grant funds

\$4.1 million in special funds allocated by Board of Supervisors

\$3.96 million in sales tax revenue \$35,000 in other grant sources.

Q: Is this money only for the Modesto Library or for branch libraries too? A: The State Library grant funding is only for the Modesto Library.

Q: What is the timeline for the project?

A: The initial schedule estimates the 30% design package will be complete in April 2024 and construction is anticipated to commence in November 2024 with completion by November 2026.

Q: Is the Modesto library going to be closed to the public while this work is being done?

A: Yes, the nature of this work is such that we will need to be closed to the public during construction.

Q: Where and how will people be able to check out books and use computers and attend activities such as Children's Story Time?

library services in Modesto. We hope to secure a downtown location for temporary services that will hopefully include hold pick-ups, access to computers and printing, and story time. Q: How will the Modesto Library be different - inside and outside - when the project is finished?

A: This renovation focuses on the interior. When the doors reopen, we hope to invite the public into a warm and welcoming environment, with improved layouts for flow and safety, updated shelving plans, and a much-needed facelift while preserving the feel of the library that we love so much.
