To sum up these last few months, I have to begin with a huge feeling of gratitude for our community and especially for you, our Friends of the Turlock Public Library.

We are thankful the renovation has continued and is nearing completion. Thankful for the *Focusing on the Future* of the Turlock Library 2020 fundraising committee who set a goal of one million dollars to ensure the Turlock branch will be a gem when opened. In the end, the committee brought in \$1.5 million in community pledges and donations. Local families and companies such as Hilmar Cheese are now a part of the legacy of our library. How are these donations being spent? The Friends' board which meets monthly has been looking at furnishings and technology upgrades, asking very specific questions and then authorizing the expenditures. Thus far, the board has allocated approximately \$236,700 for such items as tables and chairs, fixtures and equipment, children's learning toys, masonry in the courtyard and a learning tree for the children's room. The donor wall, donated by Patrick Jensen is now in the final design phase with Jeani Ferrari's expert eye.We hope to have a grand opening for our donors during the first part of August. So exciting!

We are also grateful for our volunteer board which has met via Zoom every month to make very big decisions regarding the funds.

Our fiscal year ends this June when we have our annual meeting to announce the board officers and to say thank you to the board members who are leaving us.

Many of you are familiar with Brooks Judd who has served for over twelve years in some capacity from public advocacy to helping set up the Turlock Farmer's Market tables to writing articles for the *Bee* and the *Journal*. We will miss his sense of humor and dedication to the library. You will still see him volunteering in the Friends' Bookstore this fall.

Thank you to Karon Johnson for her volunteer efforts to support the Friends for the last two years. We wish her well and hope to see her at the library.

We will acknowledge their years of service at our June meeting. Thank you to Diane Bartlett who has served as our branch manager for several years and been such an advocate . We will miss her but wish her the best retirement.

Plan to attend the June board meeting via Zoom and get to meet the new librarian and hear more details about the opening.

The *Opening Doors Art* contest, a juried exhibition sponsored jointly by the Friends of the Turlock Public Library and Turlock's Carnegie Arts Center, received ninety entries, including paintings, photographs, drawings, prints, ceramics, sculpture, book arts and fiber arts.

We invite you to visit the Carnegie Arts Center May 5th - August 1st to enjoy the artists' work. The exhibition is sure to be a feast for the eyes and a celebration of the many ways libraries serve communities.

The prize winning art will also be displayed at the Grand Reopening Celebration for our new Turlock library in late July or early August (date and time to be announced soon).

Lisa McDermott, Carnegie Arts Center Director and Sandie Sing, FOTPL Board Member, retired art teacher, artist and former Turlock City Arts Commissioner chose fifty pieces to be judged.

Judges Vito Chiesa, Chair of the Stanislaus County Board of Supervisors, Keith Boggs, Retired Stanislaus County Assistant CEO and recording and visual artist, and Sarah Dentan, Stanislaus County Library Director will choose seven prize winners.

In addition to the visual art created with libraries in mind, Stella Beratlis has written and will perform a poem at the Grand Reopening. Stella is an MJC librarian, Modesto poet laureate

Membership Update by Diane Gray, Membership Committee

The spring months are usually pretty quiet for the Friends' Membership Committee because by this time most of our loyal supporters have renewed their memberships. This year Covid-19 issues and the closure of our library building could have been a real problem for a group such as ours. Instead, we are thrilled to report that membership applications, both new and renewed, have continued to come in!

Last year, at the end of April, 2020, our organization had 154 paid members. As has often been the case, more than one-third of those folks joined during the three days of our book sale in January.

A year later, as this newsletter is published, we are excited to report that we have 144 paid members! Yes, we have a few less than last year. But, as most of us sadly recall, we had to cancel our January 2021 book sale. We are so grateful that, despite not being bolstered by our usual large number of book-sale-generated applications, our membership is down by only ten.

In addition, we have gained four more of our special Life memberships this year!

Without the aid the book sale provides and with no in-person library visits to remind you, it has been truly gratifying to watch you, our community, rally to keep our Friends' membership numbers holding steady. We are not the county's largest non-profit organization but together we have made a *huge* difference in what the Turlock branch will offer. Together we are providing the extras that will make our library truly unique. When the county budget can't cover the cost of the best material, equipment or educational toys, our county librarian and the entire county government have learned they can count on us for help.

With a great deal of appreciation for what you have already done, please allow me to remind you that, unless you are among those who invested in last year's one-time-only Multi-Year option, your membership will expire June 30. As we do each year, we ask that you join us or renew your membership by July 1. A membership application is on page 4. Our work depends on your generosity.
