Free Medicare basics program at the Modesto Library

Adults seeking a basic understanding of Medicare can have their questions answered at the library this September

Community members are invited to attend a free, informational Medicare workshop on Thursday, Sept. 20 at 2 p.m. Health care advisor Denise Cagle will be available to discuss the basics of Medicare and answer Medicare related questions.

The program will feature such topics as what Medicare Part A and Part B covers, and qualifications for enrollment eligibility. Cagle will also discuss Medicare Supplement vs. Medicare Advantage.

“Making decisions about Medicare can be life changing, so it is important to understand all of the choices available and steps involved,” said Vicki Salinas, reference librarian. “While Medicare coverage begins at age 65, you are encouraged to plan for enrollment before then.”
