September Events at the Newman Library

The Newman Library will host free activities, crafts and an informational program this September.

Toddlers and preschoolers can enjoy “Wee Move and Play” on Fridays, Sept. 8 and 22 at 10 a.m. This program features an hour of music, movement, and sensory play.

Children can explore how scientists work together as a team with a STEAM* craft on Saturday, Sept. 9 at 1:30 p.m. (*STEAM: Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, Math) Participants will form teams for a friendly competition and take part in exercises in team work as a “Teammachine.” STEAM crafts are designed for children in kindergarten and older; children 4 and under must be supervised by a parent.

The library will offer a rock art craft on Tuesday, Sept. 12 at 3 p.m. Children can decorate rocks using colorful paints and markers.

Adults are invited to the “On the Road to Citizenship: Naturalization 101” program on Tuesday, Sept. 12 at 6 p.m. This free program will focus on the basics of naturalization. A representative from United States Citizenship and Immigration Services will give an overview of what it takes to become a citizen and how eligibility is determined in the naturalization process. The program will address the naturalization interview and how to avoid potential scams. On the Road to Citizenship is sponsored by United States Citizenship and Immigration Services.

The library will host LEGO® Days on Thursdays, Sept. 14 and 28 at 3:30 p.m. Participants will have the opportunity to create LEGO® displays for the library. Children under the age of 4 must have direct parental supervision. LEGO Days are sponsored by the Friends of the Newman Library.

Children and teens can take part in a Perler beads craft on Tuesday, Sept. 26 at 3 p.m. Participants will use small, colorful beads and pre-printed designs to create images that fuse together when heat is applied.
