Community members are invited to take advantage of the free programs offered by the Oakdale Library this March.

The Friends of the Oakdale Library will host a Used Book sale on Tuesday, March 6 and Wednesday, March 7 from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m., and Thursday, March 8 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. Shoppers will have an opportunity to shop a selection of gently used books for all ages, at bargain prices. The book sale will be held next to the library at the Gene Bianchi Community Center, located at 110 S. 2nd Avenue.

Preschool Story Time will be held on Tuesdays at 10:30 a.m. Story Times feature new and classic picture books, flannel board and puppet stories, fingerplays, music and dancing, for preschoolers ages 3 to 5 and their caregivers, however all ages are welcome.
