From the Librarian's Desk by Karina Mendoza

We ended our 2023/2024 fiscal year with a bang, and we couldn't have done it without you! We were able to purchase additional Story Time mats, so now the kids have more room to dance without the fear of slipping and falling. This past year we offered 98 Story Times and Wiggle Worms with 4,535 attendees. They all had a comfortable place to enjoy those stories thanks to your financial support. We were able to increase our early learning toys for Wee Move and Play, our preschool play group. We replaced and added new toys to our Early Learning Center in the Children's room. Kids already love playing with our building table where they can practice their building skills, pattern and color recognition, and imagination with translucent blocks. We offered 77 children's programs, where kids learned art techniques and STEAM* skills. Teens and tweens had the opportunity to attend 48 programs in the Maker Space. Teens and tweens extracted DNA from strawberries, dissected owl pellets, and learned about simple circuits while creating art pieces that lit up, just to name a few. Our very popular adult sewing classes began in November of 2023. The classes ranged from decorative fabric pumpkins to an origami book bag. Our sewing classes would not have been possible without the help of Friend Volunteers Mary and Gity. I would also like to thank former FOTL board member Julie for keeping our Chess Club active and for helping us transition to our monthly Wednesday evening club.

Have you ever been curious about the night sky or wanting to learn a new hobby like leather working? We are now offering Project Steam Kits geared to toward Adults/Teens. Each kit has a book, an activity, and a digital resource guide. The kits range from Bird Watching that comes with a binoculars, Astronomy that has a telescope to Leatherworking that includes a leather bookmarking activity so you can make and keep a leather bookmark. There are ten different kits to choose from, and each kit check out for 21 days just like a book.

Board games are now available to check out at the library! If you have young ones over, why not bust boredom without busting the bank? There are currently 46 games and growing for all ages. There are classics like Backgammon, Clue, and Yahtzee. Feel free to try out some newer games like Everdell, Unstable Unicorns, or Wingspan.
