Did you know that with your Stanislaus County Library card you have access to all of our databases from the comfort of your own home? The library has databases on a variety of topics for customers of all ages. There are several that are geared toward helping students with research, exam prep and college admission essays. The *Auto Repair Source* is a how to manual for repairing and servicing vehicles. My personal favorite is *Novelist Plus*. It is a reading recommendation database for fiction and nonfiction books. If you are unsure what to read next, that is the database for you! We recently added four databases. *Northstar Digital Literacy* and *LinkedIn Learning* are both excellent if you are looking for job training or to further your professional development. *Coursera* has amazing online courses taught by leading college and university professors. If you are a creative person or just want to learn how to take better photos with your cell phone check out *Skill Share Premium*.
