Jackie has worked the table at the Farmers' Market and events at the Carnegie Art Center as well as other FOTPL fundraisers. For the second year Jackie has been involved with dd's Discount Store in Turlock to provide more than \$3,000 worth of books for the library and area youth through the Youth Literacy Project.

When the long time chairperson for our annual book sale retired, Jackie stepped in to fill the void. This is a two-and-a-half-day event involving several committees and many volunteers. From getting out yard signs to clean-up, Jackie was there. Result: the best book sale event. Two weeks later Jackie agreed to co-chair our other fundraiser, the fashion show and tea.

Jackie recently implemented a program honoring the employees at the Turlock Library.





Diane was born and raised in the East Bay (Castro Valley/San Leandro); however, she visited the Turlock area many times in the 60s to visit her maternal aunt and uncle. Her mother's distant relatives also lived in the area, and one of them, according to *Tinkham's History of Stanislaus County*, was the "custodian of the books in the Tegner library." It always seemed appropriate that she should be working at the local public library.

After attending parochial schools in San Leandro and Hayward, she received her BA degree in liberal studies from California State University, Hayward (now California State University East Bay) in 1981, and her Master's in Library and Information Science from San Jose State University in 1986. She became a librarian because of love of a good story and the search for answers to informational questions. While earning her Master's, Diane found her niche in Children's Services. She came to Stanislaus County Library in 1995 as a Children's Librarian at the Modesto Library. During the more than twenty years with Stanislaus County, she has had the opportunity to be promoted to Regional Supervising Librarian. This is her second time being assigned to Turlock, making this her ninth year at the branch.



As a Supervising Librarian, Diane is responsible for the day to day operation of the Turlock branch. She helps with opening procedures and work at the public desk, but the majority of her day is spent working on collection development (selecting and deselecting books), planning programs, scheduling, training and evaluating staff, working on the budget, and responding to emergencies. Diane participates in outreach opportunities such as staffing informational booths and speaking to community groups. She is the Young Adult Materials Selector for all thirteen library branches in Stanislaus County, and she leads the Teen Book Club and Teen Advisory Board meetings. She is also the chair of the library's Adult Program Committee.

She and her husband, David, live in Modesto and just celebrated their thirty-sixth wedding anniversary. They have two daughters: Linnea and Anne. During her free time, she likes to listen to audio books, play online games, walk, cook, watch mystery and detective programs, work on puzzles and spend time with her family, which includes Maple the cat.

April • Kim Arreola

Kim was born in Karlsruhe, Germany. When she was five years old she moved to the United States with her mother and sister. Her father was in the military and stationed in Germany. They settled in Concord, California. Kim moved to the Valley in 1996 and has lived in Turlock for seventeen years.
