It's time to Read, Renew, Repeat at the Turlock Library! The Stanislaus County Library Summer Reading Challenge will begin on May 21 and run through August 6. There will be two separate reading challenges: one for kids 17 and under, and the other for adults 18 and older. Kids, or their parents, can log the days that they read on Beanstack to earn virtual tickets. The virtual tickets can be entered to win prizes that we'll raffle off at the end of the summer. We will be giving away a brand-new book for anyone who signs up for the 17 and under challenge. For the adult challenge, for every book that you read, log the title to earn a virtual ticket for a prized drawing. You could even earn a bonus ticket for writing a book review. There are a variety of amazing prizes for the 18 and over challenge, including a Disney themed Loungefly backpack, a coffee bundle with a Keurig coffee maker, and, my personal favorite, a night sky themed bundle with a telescope!

The summer months are always busy at the library. We try to offer a variety of fun-free activities for the community in addition to our regular programs. Modesto Children's Museum will be hosting a STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art & Math) based program on Tuesday July 16 at 4 pm. Chris Bohjalian Captivated Audience of Avid Readers by Jane Cluff

Chris Bohjalian, held the bookish audience in the palm of his hand for an hour and a half on a recent Saturday afternoon with stories of how he became a writer and how his books and numerous articles were born.

The author displayed admirable grit at the beginning of his career, working full time at an ad agency in New York City, writing in the wee hours of the morning and receiving 250 rejection letters before a story was finally bought by Cosmopolitan magazine.

Lucky for us, he persisted, because his 20 plus page-turners have been published in over 30 languages and three have been converted to film. Bohjalian is a born storyteller and told many anecdotes as part of his beautifully crafted speech as well as in response to questions from the audience. One of my favorites was the origin story of The Flight Attendant; Bohjalian was waiting for a friend in a Manhattan bar, reflecting on the fact that he'd been in Armenia that morning, had flown home via a Russian airline and was about to have dinner eight time zones away from where he'd had breakfast. Suddenly, the Russian mob, international flight and "functioning" alcoholism together sounded like a possible novel, and he proceeded to write the first three pages on cocktail napkins in the 45 minutes before his friend arrived.

The FOTPL sold 40 books to attendees at the event and many of the buyers waited eagerly to chat with Bohjalian. The author took time to inscribe books thoughtfully and posed for many a photo.

We are grateful to our original Library Presents! Donors, Priscilla Peters and John Powers, who planted the first seed, and especially grateful to The Ralph Shabazian Memorial Trust which funded this event in particular.

On a final note, The Library Presents! Is joyfully morphing into *In Remembrance of Pat Portwood, The Library Presents!* in honor of an enthusiastic and dedicated champion of the program. Thank you, Pat!
